SUBJECT: Aluminum Foil from the People's Republic of China –
Circumvention Inquiry with Respect to the Republic of Korea and
the Kingdom of Thailand: Extension of Final Determinations in
Circumvention Inquiries

I. BACKGROUND

On July 18, 2022, the Department of Commerce (Commerce) published notice of its initiation of country-wide circumvention inquiries¹ to determine whether certain aluminum foil that is completed in the Republic of Korea and the Kingdom of Thailand using inputs from the People's Republic of China (China) are circumventing the antidumping (AD) and countervailing duty (CVD) orders on certain aluminum foil from China.² On December 1, 2022, we extended the deadlines for issuing the preliminary and final determinations in these inquiries by 75 days and

65 days, respectively.³ On February 27, 2023, we further extended the deadlines for issuing the preliminary and final determinations in these inquiries by 15 days.⁴ On March 22, 2023, we published in the *Federal Register* the *Preliminary Determinations*.⁵ On July 22, 2023, we extended the deadlines for issuing the final determinations in these inquiries by 62 days.⁶ The current deadline for the final determinations is October 3, 2023.

II. EXTENSION OF TIME LIMIT FOR FINAL RESULTS

Pursuant to 19 CFR 351.302(b), “{u}nless expressly precluded by statute, the Secretary may, for good cause, extend any time limit... .” We have received a large number of case and rebuttal briefs, many of which are of substantial length present complex arguments.⁷ Further, these circumvention inquiries pose numerous sophisticated methodological issues which Commerce requires more time to analyze.

For the above-mentioned reasons and because these inquiries are extraordinarily complicated, additional time is required in order to issue the final determinations in these circumvention inquiries. Therefore, Commerce has determined to further extend the deadlines for the final determinations in these inquiries, in accordance with 19 CFR 351.302(b). Thus, we are hereby informing interested parties that we are extending, by 45 days, the deadlines for issuing final determinations in these inquiries, until November 17, 2023.
